- 1. Age Requirements
 - Youth may participate in 4-H year from September 1st of grade three through August 31st following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:
 - Minimum age 8 (in addition to being in the 3rd
 - Maximum age 18 (as of August 31, 2015)
- Special education youth who are older than 19 and have not graduated from high school may participate in 4-H Youth Development programs as members, with approval by the county Extension agent. Participation is limited to the club or county level. County Extension staff have the option, on a case-by-case basis, to allow Special Education youth older than 19 to participate in competitive events at the club or county level.

 - o Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5
 - o Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8
 - o Senior Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12


Mark your calendar for **Saturday, October 10**. 4-H'ers across the State will be conducting community

- 3. Composition
- 4. Artwork
- 5. Uses of the 4-H Clover
- 6. Boards must be completely redone, in order to participate in the contest.

- 7. No electricity may be used.
- 8. Dimensional items used on board must be less than one foot deep, and must be at least six foot off of the ground.

VOLUNTEER SCREENING

At our August Parent Leader's Association meeting it was decided to ask parents and volunteers to pay for their own volunteer enrollment fee. This year the volunteer fee will be \$5 per year per volunteer. Volunteers will be rescreened every three years. Also, any volunteers who assist in transporting youth in their personal vehicles or who handle 4-H funds should be screened.

SHOOTING SPORTS AIMING FOR THE BULL'S EYE



Introduction to 2016 Shooting Sports Projects

The 4-H Shooting Sports Project is a comprehensive introduction to shooting sports safety and the fundamentals of shooting disciplines, including: archery, rifle, shotgun, pistol, muzzleloading, and hunting. The project requires the presence and supervision of trained and certified volunteer coaches. Therefore, not all disciplines are offered in all counties.

Also, since direct supervision by certified coaches is a requirement, this program does not allow individual participation. The minimum age to participate in 4-H Shooting Sports, is 9 years old or 8 and in the 3rd grade.

Lubbock County Shooting Sports coaches will soon be meeting to secure locations and set 2016 dates for project start-up, including: 3-position indoor rifle and archery in the spring, and shotgun project in the Summer months.

More details will follow in upcoming newsletters. If you are interested in participating in 4-H Shooting Sports, call the County Extension Office and place your name and which disciplines you are interested in on the "intent to participate" list.

District 2 Shooting Sports Leader Training Scheduled

The 4-H Shooting Sports Program requires direct supervision by certified coaches. Therefore, this program relies on adult volunteers.

KAY's KORNER

Kid-friendly Veggies and Fruits 10 tips for making healthy foods more fun for children

Encourage children to eat vegetables and fruits by making it fun. Provide healthy ingredients and let kids help with preparation, based on their age and skills. Kids may try foods they avoided in the past if they helped make them.

Smoothie creations Blend fat-free or low-fat yogurt or milk with fruit pieces and crushed ice. Use fresh, frozen, canned, and even overripe fruits. Try bananas, berries, peaches, and/or pineapple. If you freeze the fruit first, you can even skip the ice!

Delicious dippers Kids love to dip their foods. Whip up a quick dip for veggies with yogurt and seasonings such as herbs or garlic. Serve with raw vegetables like broccoli, carrots, or cauliflower. Fruit chunks go great with a yogurt and cinnamon or vanilla dip.

Caterpillar kabobs
Assemble chunks of melon, apple, orange, and pear on skewers for a fruity kabob. For a raw veggie version, use vegetables like zucchini, cucumber, squash, sweet peppers, or tomatoes.

Personalized pizzas.
Set up a pizza-making station in the kitchen. Use whole-wheat English muffins, bagels, or pita bread as the crust. Have tomato sauce, low-fat cheese, and cut-up vegetables or fruits for toppings. Let kids choose their own favorites. Then pop the pizzas into the oven to warm.

Fruity peanut butterfly

Start with carrot sticks or celery for the body. Attach wings made of thinly sliced apples with peanut butter and decorate with halved grapes or dried fruit.


Frosty fruits

Frozen treats are bound to be popular in the warm months. Just put fresh fruits such as melon chunks in the freezer (rinse first). Make "popsicles" by inserting sticks into peeled bananas and freezing.

Bugs on a log

Use celery, cucumber, or carrot sticks as the log and add peanut butter. Top with dried fruit such as raisins, cranberries, or cherries, depending on what bugs you want!

Homemade trail mix
Skip the pre-made trail mix and make your own. Use your favorite nuts and dried fruits, such as unsalted peanuts, cashews, walnuts, or sunflower seeds mixed with dried



Potato person

Decorate half a baked potato. Use sliced cherry tomatoes, peas, and low-fat cheese on the potato to make a funny face.

Put kids in charge Ask your child to name new veggie or fruit creations. Let them arrange raw veggies or fruits into a fun shape or design.
