GLOBE - 4-H LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Texas 4-H is excited to announce a NEW 4-H International program! GLOBE – Global Leadership Opportunities Beyond Education! Information available about this program on the State 4-H Website; it will provide details about this comprehensive two-tiered citizenship and leadership program designed for 4-H members in grades 6-12 (Intermediate and Senior). The program is designed to engage youth to look at their own communities through the eyes of people experiencing hunger and poverty and be inspired to take humanitarian action. As they begin to understand the perspectives of other cultures, they are more likely to have increased respect for those who are different from them.

Tier I begins now and includes youth participating in three webinars followed by an experiential leadership and teambuilding camp at Heifer Ranch in Perryville, Arkansas. The camp is **June 29 – July 2, 2016**. Texas 4-H will partner with Heifer International to create this

'international experience' without actually traveling abroad. Registration is limited to 40 youth; the deadline to register on 4-H Connect is March 13. The \$350 registration includes travel on chartered bus, all meals and lodging for the four day/3 night experience and a commemorative Tshirt. Texas A&M AgriLife personnel will chaperone the youth.

The program is available to youth in 8th - 11th grade, with participants involved until the 11th grade. Ambassadors are an asset in accomplishing the goals and outcomes of the 4-H Science Mission Mandate. Through a competitive application process, Ambassadors will be selected in April to serve as leaders in making contributions to solve local challenges, speaking publically about their 4-H STEM Futures program involvement and advising Texas 4-H STEM leadership and the National 4-H STEM Youth Ambassador on state

priorities. Texas 4-H STEM Youth Ambassadors are required to commit at least 30 hours of serve annually: participating in and helping facilitate the Lockheed Martin/4-H partnership, participating in conference calls, virtual conferences, webinars and trainings with Texas 4-H STEM, National 4-H STEM and Lockheed Martin employee mentors/volunteers in our state. National 4-H Congress

National 4-H Congress is the flagship event of the National 4-H program held annually in Atlanta, Georgia at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. Texas 4-H members apply *March 1 through April 15* on 4-H Connect and are required to have two reference letters, one of which should be from a County Extension Agent. There is no fee to apply. Selected applicants will be notified of an interview date during Texas 4-H Roundup (if attending, otherwise it will be completed by phone). Once the delegation is selected, the participation fee is \$1,500 and covers Congress registration (includes most meals), roundtrip airfare, ground transportation in Atlanta, lodging at the Hyatt Regency, educational tours, States lunch, state photograph, trading pins and commemorative shirt.

Delegates are responsible for getting to and from selected airport, luggage fees (\$25 per bag each way), spending money for souvenirs, and meals while traveling to and from Atlanta.

Youth must be in grades 9-12 at the time of the event, **November 24-29, 2016.** For more information, please refer to the Texas 4-H website. http://national4-hcongress.com/

JUNIOR/INTERMEDIATE CONTEST

INFORMATION: Entries for the County Junior 4-H Photography contest are due to the County Extension Office by Monday, March 21.

1st place entries at county, will then advance to the District Junior/Intermediate Photography Contest. County Awards will be presented during County 4-H Roundup on April 14. Please review the categories and entry information for specific guidelines. They are located on the county website or from the County Extension Office.

First Place entries will advance to District and are due by *March 31*.

- Participants may enter only 1 photo in each category and class (for a maximum of 14 entries)
- Junior/Intermediate Entries must be 4"x6" and may be mounted on photographic mount board or thin white foam board cut to same dimension. (Not required to be mounted for County, but must be for District.) Photo's must be drymounted.

- Entries must use the photography label and release form and attach it to the back of the photo entry. Labels may be downloaded from the District 4-H website. http://d24-h.tamu.edu/events/photography/

Please read the D2 photo rules and guidelines to see specific requirements for each category. Information is available on the County website under publications - 4-H.

The categories and class requirements are due for both Junior/Intermediate and Senior entries. CLASSES:

SENIOR CONTEST INFORMATION: Entries for the County Senior 4-H Photography contest are due to the County Extension Office by Monday, March 21. County Awards will be presented at 7 pm at County 4-H Roundup on April 14. 1st place entries at county, will then advance to the State 4-H Photography Contest.

For County, any size of photo may be entered, however the 1st place winner will have to email their photo to 4hevents@ag.tamu.edu - you will be given instructions for this as needed.

- Participants may enter only 1 photo in each category and class (for a maximum of 15).

The photography label/release must be attached to each photo. Please refer to the State guidelines for specific category information. They are located on the county website or from the County Extension Office.

4-H Trap & Skeet (Shotgun) Project

Plans are currently being made for the 4-H Shotgun project this summer. Participation may be limited based on availability of adequate shooting facilities as well as number of certified shooting sports coaches.

This project involves such shotgun games as Trap, Skeet, and 5-stand sporting clays. The District Contest is scheduled for **June 24-25.** Participants should be able to provide their own shotgun (usually 12 or 20 gauge), and ammunition. This project is moderately expensive, with most participants spending at least \$20 per week for ammunition and round fees, plus event registration.

If interested, contact the Lubbock County Extension Office at 806-775-1740, to place your name on the 4-H Shotgun interest list. The estimated time frame will be late April through August.

North Region 4-H Shooting Sports Coach Training

The Texas 4-H Shooting Sports program relies on certified volunteers to conduct project practices and District/State competitive events. If you are interested in being a certified Shooting Sports Coach, contact Mark Brown at the Lubbock County Extension Office at 806-775-1740. Mark serves as the agent coordinator for 4-H Shooting Sports in Lubbock County.

A 4-H Shooting Sports Coach training for all disciplines is scheduled for **April 1-2** in Lubbock. Registration closes *March 20, and volunteer screening must be completed before one can register.* The cost for the training is \$120 for early registration.

How to Make Every Week Poison Prevention Week

ACI Celebrates an Important Anniversary

In 1961, Congress enacted National Poison Prevention Week to be celebrated the third week of every March. But we believe poisonings can be prevented 24/7, 365 days a year. Shockingly, 90% of all poisonings occur in the home, which is the one environment you'd think people had the most control over.

A poisoning is when someone swallows, breathes, touches or gets splashed in the eye with a substance that can cause sickness or death. Yet not all of these substances are in and of themselves poisonous. An adult may take an aspirin to ease some pain, but when a two-year-old ingests a handful of pills thinking they're candy, it can result in much more than a headache.

Here are some poison-prevention tips:

- Keep all cleaning products out of sight and reach of children; install childproof safety latches on cabinets.
- Store food and household cleaning products in separate areas.
- Keep products in their original, labeled containers, and *read* those labels prior to use.
- If the phone or doorbell rings when you're in the middle of using a product, close the bottle or box. Many incidents happen when adults are distracted.
- Wash hands thoroughly after using a product, and likewise, wash any utensils that may have been used to measure or dispense a product.
- Turn on fans or open windows when using household and chemical products for proper ventilation.
- NEVER combine cleaning agents with ammonia. Some chemical mixtures can create deadly fumes.
- Don't use empty cleaning-product containers to store food, and likewise, never use cups or baby bottles to store detergents or cleansers.
