In the past year, our Ambassadors volunteered 5,258 hours, reaching 67,344 people, resulting in an economic impact of \$129,662.28.

The Texas 4-H Livestock Ambassador Program is an advanced leadership experience designed to enhance the knowledge and skills to become ambassadors for agricultural production systems. The short courses expose Ambassadors to rigorous college-level animal science curriculum and other educational experiences. Purposeful construction of the curriculum, fused with a commitment to hands-on learning, have generated exceptional knowledge gained outcomes. The courses take an in-depth look at sheep, goat, swine, and cattle production in Texas and how it relates to the show ring.
