4-H Trap & Skeet (Shotgun) Project

Plans are currently being made for the 4-H Shotgun project this summer. Participation may be limited based on availability of adequate shooting facilities as well as number of certified shooting sports coaches.

This project involves such shotgun games as Trap, Skeet, and 5-stand sporting clays. The District Contest is scheduled for **June 28-29**. Participants should be able to provide their own shotgun (usually 12 or 20 gauge), and ammunition. This project is moderately expensive, with most participants spending at least \$20 per week for ammunition and round fees, plus event registration.

If interested, contact the Lubbock County Extension Office at 806-775-1740, to place your name on the 4-H Shotgun interest list. The estimated time frame will be mid-April through June.

North Region 4-H Shooting Sports Coach Training The Texas 4-H Shooting Sports program relies on certified volunteers to conduct project practices and District/State competitive events. Horse Validation

Just a reminder that 4-H'ers planning on showing/ competing in the District or State Horse Show or the Big 5 Horse Shows must validate their horses by *April 15; late application of \$20 per horse is accepted through May 1.*

If you validated horses last year, they are still in the system, you will just need to reactivate them this year. For new families or new horses you will have to upload 3 pictures (front, left and right side views) and registration papers to the website. There is also still a \$10 validation fee per horse - which is paid online this year. Please do not wait until *April 15* to complete this! Contact Ronda for more information. Preparing for the Unexpected - Pets

The South Plains area is more vulnerable to wind, snow, ice, tornadoes and wild fires especially in the late Winter and early Spring and during droughts. One area of emergency preparedness families may forget is including plans for pets.

Pet owners are responsible for developing individual emergency plans for their animals. This includes medical and maintenance care arrangements and ultimately all costs associated with their animals. In the event of a disaster when you must evacuate, the most important thing you can do to protect your pets is to evacuate them as well. Leave your pets only as a last resort.

Public emergency shelters do not allow pets due to health and safety regulations. Exceptions are animals that assist people with disabilities. It may be difficult to find shelter for your pets during a disaster, so it is vital that you plan ahead for the safety of your pets. If you plan to use a public emergency shelter, you need to make other arrangements for your pets.

Get Informed

- Make phone calls. Determine your options if it is ever necessary to leave your home.
- Call hotels/motels at your destination to learn their policies and regulations concerning pets. Ask if they would waive a "No Pets" policy in an emergency.
- Make a list of pet-friendly places. Include telephone numbers and addresses of pet boarding facilities and veterinarians.
- Ask friends or relatives who live outside of the affected areas if they would be willing to care for your pets.

Most animal control shelters and humane society shelters will need to prepare for lost and stray pet disaster victims. Most likely, they will not be able to take your pets.

Be Prepared

Put together a pet emergency supply kit, and keep the kit with your evacuation kit. Include:

- medical and current vaccination records from your veterinarian
- any medications your pet needs

- first-aid kit
- sturdy leash and carrier to transport your pet(s) (muzzles?)
- three day supply of food and water
- current photos in case your pet gets lost
- pet beds and toys
- manual can opener (if canned food)
- cat litter and pan (if your pet is a cat)
- newspaper, paper towels, plastic bags, cleaner, and disinfectants to properly handle pet waste (zip-style plastic bags)

Be sure all pets have collars and up-to-date ID tags. To your pet's collar, attach a temporary tag with a phone number and address of a contact person outside the disaster area.

Microchip implants are available at vet offices to assist in more easily locating lost pets.

When a storm is approaching, either bring your pets into the house, or put them in a kennel or cage so you will not have to look for them if you're in a hurry.

Respond

There are precautions you can take to increase your pet's chances of survival if they must be left in place; however, they are not substitutes for evacuating your pets.

- Leave your pet supply kit accessible.
- Notify a nearby friend or neighbor that your pets are at home.
- Leave a visible sign in windows indicating that pets are inside.
- Make sure all pets wear current ID tags.
- Do **not** leave any pet outside or tied up during a hurricane.
- Consider a location for your pet that will be away from possible flood waters. Provide pets an escape route.
- Leave only dry food, which will not spoil easily. Leave fresh water in bathtubs or non-spill containers.
- If you have difficult or dangerous animals, leave them in special crates or cages to reduce the possibility of them getting loose. This will also assist emergency personnel if they need to handle these animals.

After the Disaster

After the disaster, the most trustworthy pets may panic, hide, try to escape, bite, or scratch. Be extremely cautious and gentle. When you return home, give them time to settle back into their routines. Consult your veterinarian if any behavioral problems arise.

Child Abuse Prevention and You

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. National Child Abuse Prevention month highlights the importance of working together to prevent child abuse and neglect and promote the well being of children and families. According tot he South Plains Coalition for child Abuse Prevention, there were 1,032 confirmed cases of child abuse in Lubbock County in 2017. This number is double the average number of cases reported for Texas. There were also 172 confirmed child deaths due to child abuse or neglect in Texas in 2017. It is important to reduce the number of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) or traumatic events that a child or teen experiences before age 18. ACES include all forms of child abuse such as physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and neglect. ACES also include parent mental illness, substance use, incarceration, and exposure to domestic violence. It has been well documented since the early 1900s that the greater the number of ACES an individual experience, the greater their risk for negative outcomes. Negative

outcomes linked with ACES include, but are not limited to, poorer physical and mental health, greater substance use, increased risky behaviors, and these can have lasting negative outcomes well into adulthood.

If you are interested in learning more about child abuse prevention, you can attend the 7th Annual Child Abuse Conference presented by Covenant Children's Hospital on **April 5-6.** Tickets are available online and preregistration is required.

There are several ways that you can get involved in our local Lubbock Community to prevent child abuse and promote the well being of families.

- If you suspect child abuse, please call the Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-252-5400. Your call could save the life of a child.
- Go Blue for Child Abuse by wearing a blue shirt on April 26 and post a picture of you wearing blue on your social media pages.
- Get out into the community and attend on of the events that helps support groups that work with children and families. One such event is the 21st Annual Blue Ribbon Rally hosted by the Family Guidance & Outreach Center of Lubbock on **April 27**th in the Depot District.
- The Buckner Spring Tea on March 31st from 2-4pm. Tickets can be purchased from their websitewww.buckner.org.
- Sponsor or coordinate a drive for new toys, blankets, or snack supplies for the children who are served by the Children's Advocacy Center of the South Plains. You can find more information at www.safeplace4kids.org.
- Become a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for a young person who is involved in the foster care system due to experiencing abuse, neglect, or another ACE. To get information about CASA, you can contact Kristen at kristenm@castofthesouthplains.org or call her (806) 763-2272.
