Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Program

The Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Program is looking for teens that are *motivated*, *excited*, *and ready to make a change in their community!* This program is designed for high school age youth who have a passion for health and wellness. These youth will be trained at the regional level to become youth health experts who can motivate others to make a change in their lifestyle to improve their health. More importantly, *these ambassadors will assist local county extension agents with program efforts*, *project activities*, *and much more!*

Youth do <u>not</u> have to be current 4-H members, but must be willing to join 4-H. Eligibility requirements include:

- Be in at least the 9th grade at beginning of the 2020-2021 school year
- Submit completed application to the local county extension office by May 1, 2020

 Have an interest and passion to serve others in the area of health education which includes nutrition, physical activity, passenger safety, and safe environments!

After youth are accepted to the local program, they must fulfill the following obligations:

- Complete and report 40* hours of leadership, program efforts, or community service annually. *This is a reduction in previous hours to be consistent with other ambassador programs.
- Attend a Regional Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Summit in a location nearest to them.
- Attend face-to-face and online trainings.
- Remain academically eligible.
- Must agree to the obligations and requirements outlined in the HT Youth Ambassador Handbook.
- Ambassadorship is a 12-month commitment, beginning June 2020. Ambassadors who fulfill the minimum (40) hours of service will be invited to reapply for the following year. New and returning ambassadors MUST complete a new application annually.
- To meet all commitments for which the Ambassador volunteers and to complete those commitments with excellence.

Ambassadors who are selected will be required to pay the estimated registration fee of \$75-\$100 for the regional Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Summit. They will also be responsible for any travel costs related to this or other trainings established by the county extension agent or regional Healthy Texas Youth Ambassador Team. Actual program costs will vary from county to county and be dependent on activities and trainings offered. Interested youth will apply to the local office of Texas A&M AgriLife Extension *no later than May 1*. Ambassadors should be selected by a local committee and be notified of acceptance by **June 1**. Those selected will be expected to attend the regional training on **July 21**. Please contact Ronda for more information or to apply.

County Awards will be presented at 7 pm at County 4-H Roundup on April 2. 1st place entries at county, will then advance to the State 4-H Photography Contest.

For County, any size of photo may be entered, however the 1st place winner will upload their entries on 4-H Connect, so be sure to keep up with the digital version of the photos you enter.

- Participants may enter only 1 photo in each category and class (for a maximum of 15).

4-H Photography Workshops

We will again have 2 workshops for the 4-H Photography Project. The first workshop is scheduled for **Thursday, March 12 at 5:30 pm** at the County Extension Office. The next workshop will be scheduled at the March 12

meeting. This will be a basic photography workshop conducted by Vikram Baliga.

4-H Parents - Photography Contest

This year we will offer a County Photography Contest for 4-H parents to enter. Entries are same as for 4-H'ers: due **March 23**, 4x6 print. Categories for parents: Dominant Color, Macro/Detail, Animals-Domestic, Animals - Wildlife, Elements of Design, People, Food, Nature/Landscape, Plant/Flora, and Motion. Include name, and category on the back of the photo.

4-H Trap & Skeet (Shotgun) Project

Plans are currently being made for the 4-H Shotgun project this summer. Participation may be limited based on availability of adequate shooting facilities as well as number of certified shooting sports coaches.

This project involves such shotgun games as Trap, Skeet, and 5-stand sporting clays. The District Contest is scheduled for **June 26-27.** Participants should be able to provide their own shotgun (usually 12 or 20 gauge), and ammunition. This project is moderately expensive, with most participants spending at least \$20 per week for ammunition and round fees, plus event registration.

If interested, contact the Lubbock County Extension Office at 806-775-1740, to place your name on the 4-H Shotgun interest list by April 13. The estimated time frame will be mid-April through June.

North Region 4-H Shooting Sports Coach Training

A North Region 4-H Shooting Sports Coach training for all disciplines is scheduled for **April 4-5** in Lubbock. Registration closes *March 16*, *and volunteer screening must be completed before one can register*. The cost for the training is \$120 for early registration.

If you validated horses last year, they are still in the system, you will just need to reactivate them this year. For new families or new horses you will have to upload 3 pictures (front, left and right side views) and registration papers to the website. There is also still a \$10 validation fee per horse - which is paid online this year. Please do not wait until *April 15* to complete this! Contact Ronda for more information.

Parental Involvement Contributes to Children's Academic Success

Caregivers, teachers, peers, extended family, media, heredity, and the environment all contribute to a child's development; however, parents (if present) are the most powerful influence in the lives of their children. Parental involvement not only shapes development during the initial years of life, but also during the adolescent and adult years.

Given this important role, to what extent should parents be involved in their children's development? According to the National PTA, "Parental involvement is the participation of parents in every facet of the education and development of children from birth to adulthood, recognizing that parents are the primary influence in their children's lives." Parents have a tremendous responsibility to be involved with their children both inside and outside the home

Decades of research have demonstrated that the more involved parents are in their children's development, the greater chance children have to succeed, particularly in their academic performance. Consistently, researchers have discovered that greater parental involvement in a child's education is associated with:

- higher student grades and test scores,
- better attendance,
- higher rates of homework completion,
- more positive student attitudes and behavior,
- higher graduation rates, and
- greater enrollment rates in post-secondary education.

When parents are involved, children achieve more regardless of their socioeconomic level, ethnic/racial background, or the parents' educational level (Henderson & Mapp, 2002).

As recent research on early brain development has shown, positive parental involvement needs to begin long before children enter into formal schooling arrangements. The early years of a child's life are critically important for healthy brain development, attachment formation, and language acquisition. When parents become actively involved with their children at an early age, they lay a foundation for learning that will benefit children for the rest of their lives.

Child Abuse Prevention and You

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, National Child Abuse Prevention month highlights the importance of working together to prevent child abuse and neglect and promote the well being of children and families. According to the South Plains Coalition for Child Abuse Prevention, there were 1,032 confirmed cases of child abuse in Lubbock County in 2017. This number is double the average number of cases reported for Texas. There were also 172 confirmed child deaths due to child abuse or neglect in Texas in 2017. We also know that an average of 3 children experience child abuse or neglect each day. It is important to reduce the number of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) or traumatic events that a child or teen experiences before age 18. ACES include all forms of child abuse such as physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and neglect. ACES also include parent mental illness, substance use, incarceration, and exposure to domestic violence. It has been well documented since the early 1900's that the greater the number of ACES an individual experiences, the greater their risk for negative outcomes. Negative outcomes linked with ACES include, but are not limited to, poorer physical and mental health, greater substance use, increased risky behaviors, and these

can have lasting negative outcomes well into adulthood. For more information on ACEs, please visit the CDC website for the ACEs Study.

There are several ways that you can get involved in our local Lubbock Community to prevent child abuse and promote the well being of families.

- If you suspect child abuse, please call the Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-252-5400. Your call could save the life of a child.
- Go Blue for Child Abuse by wearing a blue shirt during the month of April and post a picture on your social media pages to bring awareness to child abuse.
- Get out into the community and attend one of the events that helps support groups that work with children and families.
- Participate in the GO BLUE Lubbock Kickoff Event on March 27th at 8:30 am at Covenant Women and Children's Hospital.
- You can attend the 2020 Child Maltreatment Conference presented by the South Plains Coalition to Prevent Child Abuse and Covenant Children's Hospital on April 3-4, 2020. Tickets are available online and preregistration is required.
- Sponsor or coordinate a drive for new toys, blankets, or snack supplies for the children who are served by the Children's Advocacy Center of the South Plains. You can find more information at www.safeplace4kids.org.
- Become a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) for a young person who is involved in the foster care system due to experiencing abuse, neglect, or another ACE. To get information about CASA, you can contact Kristen at kristenm@castofthesouthplains.org or call her (806) 763-2272.

We all have heard the adage that it takes a village to raise a child. Please get involved and help support the children and families that live in our local Lubbock community.
