in a high tunnel*



## 21. MOUNTAIN SPRING

Remarks: Good quality fruit resistant to cracking, blossom end rot, verticillium wilt (V), and fusarium wilt (F).  
72 Days - Determinate - 8-10oz  
Trial Totals: 54 fruits 15.101 lbs.

## 22. SILETZ

Remarks: Early dark red, flavorful and parthenocarpic (seedless) fruits. Resistant to verticillium wilt (V) and fusarium wilt (F).  
52 Days - Determinate - 7-10oz  
Trial Totals: 85 fruits 10.552 lbs.



## 23. SUPER SWEET 100

Remarks: Bears long, branched clusters of cherry sized sweet fruits high in sugar. Resistant to verticillium wilt (V) and fusarium wilt (F).  
70 Days - Indeterminate - 1oz  
Trial Totals: 995 fruits 6.196 lbs.

## 24. HEATMASTER

Remarks: Had major problems with blight. Resistant to alternaria stem canker (Aal), gray leaf spot (Ss), verticillium wilt (V), nematodes, and fusarium wilt (F).  
75 Days - Determinate - 7oz  
Trial Totals: 15 fruits 2.046 lbs.



## 25. BLACK PRINCE

Remarks: Heirloom meant for cooler climates but still sold locally. Beautiful mahogany color.  
70 Days - Indeterminate - 2-5oz  
Trial Totals: 11 fruits 1.282 lbs.
