For intermediate and juniors - DO NOT use the forms off of the State 4-H website – they are different.

Bring all of your recordbook questions and materials to begin work on your recordbook. Please call the County Extension Office, 775-1740, by *May 23* if you plan on attending the training. County recordbook Judging will be held on **Tuesday**, **June 21**, beginning at 1:00 pm. All volunteers are welcomed to assist with judging. Judging is a great way to learn more about the process. Please RSVP to Ronda by *June 20*, if you can assist!
